Part II

A. GENERAL COMMENTS ON THE EXAMINATION

There were 38.5% Firsts this year, a marked increase on the previous year. Examiners were satisfied with the standard exhibited by candidates. The MCEs were carefully considered by Board.

B. EQUALITY AND DIVERSITY ISSUES AND BREAKDOWN OF THE RESULTS BY GENDER

Given the small sample size, it is difficult to draw strong conclusions. The proportion of firsts awarded to male candidates (40%) quite narrowly exceeded that awarded to females (37.5%).

C. COMMENTS ON PAPERS AND INDIVIDUAL QUESTIONS

There was a certain spread for some candidates between Economics and History papers, reflecting the disciplinary demands distinct to each. The average marks in History papers and Economics papers were as follows:
