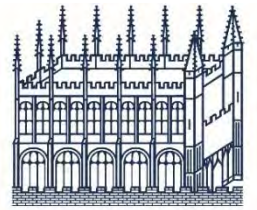

Student search behaviour: Google vs. the Library

did not examine their topics to identify keywords and related terms

performed simple keyword or phrase queries

did not reformulate or refine their search queries

did not move beyond the first page of results

did not examine metadata to improve searches

frequently visited commercial sites such as Amazon; content farms such as About.com; and subscription databases such as JSTOR.

Systematic literature searching: make a plan

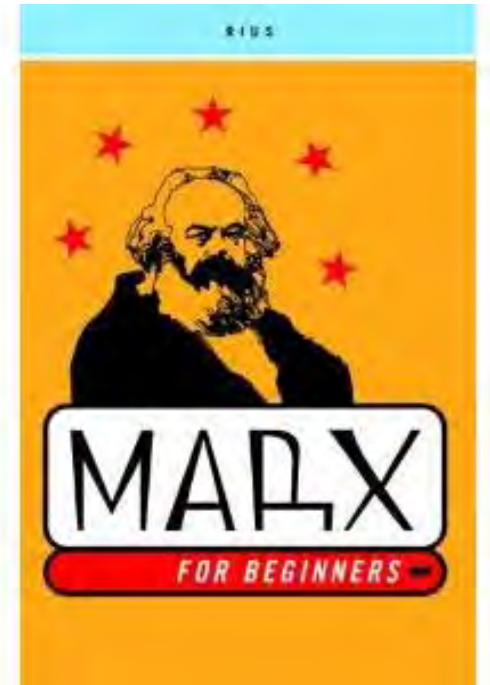

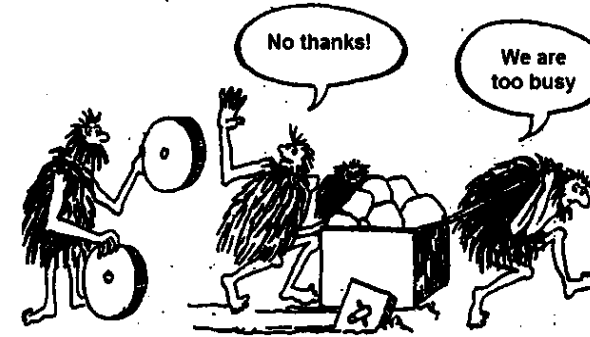



Key text-based resources

- Early English Books Online (EEBO)**
Useful for the early colonial period, this digital collection of early printed books 1473-1700 contains over 96,000 images of titles listed in Pollard & Redgrave's Short-Title Catalogue (1475 - 1640) and Wing's Short-Title Catalogue (1641-1700) and their revised edition. Includes works printed in British North America. Most is not full-text searchable. Use the EEBO TCP version.
- Eighteenth Century Collections Online (ECCO)**
Useful for the early colonial period, this digital collection of 150,000 English-language titles and editions published between 1701 and 1800. ECCO includes every significant English-language and foreign-language title printed in the United Kingdom, along with thousands of important works from the Americas.
- Making of the Modern World, 1450-1850**
Provides digital facsimile images on every page of 61,000 works of literature on social and economic history published from 1450 through 1850. A vast collection of material on commerce, finance, social conditions, politics, trade and transport.
- Early American Imprints - Evans 1639-1800**
Collection of early printed American imprints (1639-1800), compiled originally in the American Bibliography by Charles Evans and enhanced by Roger Bristol's Supplement to Charles Evans's American Bibliography. The collection of 37,000+ imprints embraces every aspect of life in 17th and 18th century America (history, literary, religion, witchcraft, agriculture, foreign affairs, temperance, etc.).

Recruitment, Conscription and Conscientious Objectors

National Archives, conscription appeal records

The National Archives has digitised up to 11,000 case papers relating to individuals seeking exemption from conscription into the Army during WWI. The conscription appeal records are from the Middlesex Appeal Tribunal, and include administrative papers reflecting the changing policy towards conscription as the war progressed. This is one of only two complete surviving collections of tribunal records, and the sample provides a valuable insight into the impact of WWI on families, businesses and communities. The records reveal men seeking exemption on medical, family or economic grounds as well

CYMRU 1914, digitised resources

Britain's army at the beginning of the First World War was relatively small and professional. With conscription not introduced until 1916, the recruitment of volunteers in large numbers became a huge challenge. The Parliamentary Recruitment Committee circulated leaflets and posters, and organised rallies and other public events in order to boost figures. Considerable social pressure was brought to bear on men to volunteer, and those who did not risked vilification as cowards.

For many men, however, awareness of their responsibilities towards their families as wage earners proved a compelling disincentive to volunteer. Posters like this targeted that sense of duty to family, but instead suggested that, in the future, children would hold their fathers to account on the service that they performed for their country rather than the security they ensured for their immediate family.


Oxford University Roll of Service



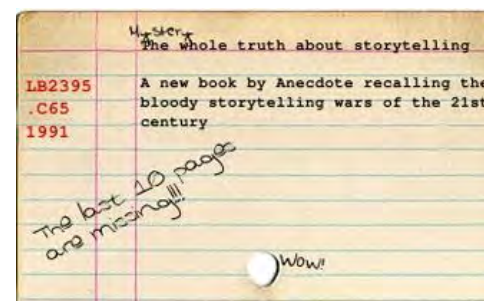

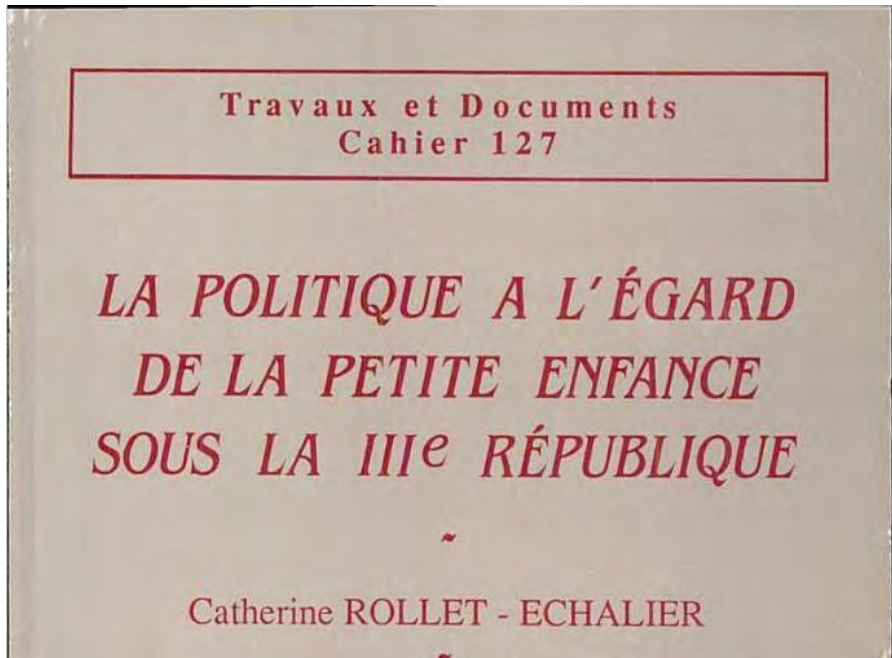
Subject searches

Bring together synonyms, variant spellings, etc.

Consistent & reliable use of language

Retrieves all entries on subject regardless of language used by author

Works for any subject (Religion, English, etc.)



Library of Congress subject headings
(LCSH)

Child welfare -- France -- History

Social values -- Great Britain -- History -- 19th century

Dr Barnardo's (Organization) -- History

Germany -- Social policy -- 19th century

Word of caution



Library of Congress Subject Headings are Anglo-American standards

LCSH started in 1909

Different LCSH standards at different times

Uses US spelling

Generally adopted by UK libraries once moved to online catalogues (1970s/80s)

Generally not used on the continent

Beware of generic v specific subjects entries

Your topic may not exist (yet)

Only works for books & cover journal articles you find in e.g. SOLO

Libraries may not (yet) have full catalogue records for recently received books – or even for

older stock

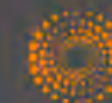

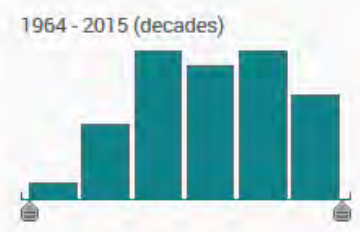
